PROTECTION OF CIVILIANS

Deployment of 78 CLAs



including 16 women



in 42 POB/TOBs in Bangui and



11 Field Offices (EW/RR system).



Due to the efficient functioning of the EW/RR, the Mission launched POC military operations against UPC/CPC elements in the Ouanda-Djalle - Sam Ouandja and Ouadda triangle in June 2022.



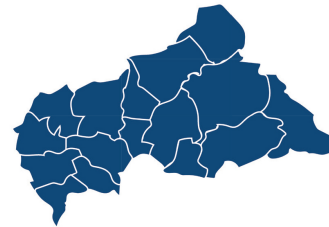
Establishment of 83 operational Community Alert Networks (CAN), with the participation of 3,500 trained POC volunteers, including around 1,980 women, and the production of 65 Community Protection Plans (CPP).



Establishment of 67 Local Committees for the prevention and peaceful resolution of transhumance related conflicts and the promotion of a peaceful coexistence between herders and local communities. More than 200 conflicts were resolved by these committees between July 2021 and June 2022.

RESTORATION AND EXTENSION OF STATE AUTHORITY



Supported GoCAR with a civil servants' presence mapping: gradual deployment increase of 1,315 civil agents in 2015 to 3,418 in 2019 and reaching 4,549 in 2022. Benchmark was 6,500 civil servants before 2013 crisis.



Supported the deployment of 2,206 at the end of 31 December, including 238 women, to their respective posts since 2014.



Supported capacity building of 9,422 civil servants, including 1,588 women, across the country since 2014.



On the joint Luanda-APPR roadmap, continues to support GoCAR through the identification and implementation of civil servants presence as well as movement control mechanisms.



Rehabilitation and/or equipping of 272 administrative buildings (including 44 QIPs to support RESA in 2015-2022).

DIALOGUE & RECONCILIATION



Supported the Ministry of Humanitarian Action and National Reconciliation in the creation and capacity building of 15 Local Peace and Reconciliation Committees (CLPRs) in Birao, Bria, Obo, Bambari, Berberati, Bossangoa, Bouar, Kaga Bandoro, Ndélé, Paoua, Bangassou, Sibut, Boali, Bossembele, and Yaloke since 2020. Provides technical support to 32 other CLPRs created by the Ministry of Reconciliation with support from UNDP, DPAM, and DCA.



Trained nearly 2,000 community leaders (CLPR members, youth, women, and religious leaders), including 500 women in peaceful conflict resolution and community reconciliation since 2015.



115 community conflicts peacefully resolved since 2016 related to internal displacement and reintegration, transhumance, and inter-community conflicts fueled by armed groups.



11 local peace agreements signed between communities in conflict or following inter-community violence in Boeing, Castors, Rex (Bangui), Zemio-Rafai, Obo, Bangassou, Pombolo-Gambo, Bria, Kaga-Bandoro, Zemio and Mbrès since 2016.

QIPs



Since 2014, 704 projects (an average of 85 per year) have been implemented with a cumulative budget of over USD 24 million, reaching 7 million direct beneficiaries including 58% women and 42% men. 8,000 people benefited from temporary jobs and work experience.

In the budget cycle of 2022-23, 90 projects will be implemented, namely, 40 for POC, mainly bridges and ferries, 25 to support the political process and RESA, and 25 projects in support of reintegration and socio-economic empowerment.
